VACCINATION RULES FOR PARTICIPATION IN LONG DISTANCE SLED DOG RACE.

The race follows the NHF's vaccination regulations. See link.

NOTE: According to NHF's rules, dogs can not participate if the microchip does not work / exist / is not readable.

All dogs to participate must be vaccinated against the following:

distemper

parvovirus

Contagious hepatitis (hepatitis).

Kennel cough, combination vaccine set as solution in the dog's nostrils.

All these vaccines must be certified by the veterinarian and valid on the first day of the race.

The name and vaccination date of the vaccine must be confirmed by the veterinarian in the dog's passport or vaccination card. The dog's passport or vaccine card must contain the dog's name, date of birth, chip number / ID.

Note: according to the NHF's vaccination regulations, chip insertion must be performed at the latest at the time of vaccination if vaccination has been performed after 1 November 2012.

In accordance with recommendations and doping regulations, injection vaccines must be set at least 14 days before start of the race. For intranasal vaccine it is 6 weeks (42 days)

The first rabies vaccine is not valid until after 21 days.

In addition, it is recommended that all vaccinations of racing dogs, regardless of vaccine, be performed in the quiet time of the summer semester. Due to usage of immunoproteins during the racing season, a better effect of vaccines is expected during the summer and the risk of side effects is less.
